Form 990, Part III, Line 4a - First Accomplishment

Calendar year 2020 was a productive year for the NGA Center for Best

Practices (NGA Center). Top among our accomplishments was a nearly yearlong response effort to aid Governors combatting the ongoing COVID-19

pandemic. Additionally, the NGA Center built out a new support network for
Governors' legal counsel; launched a new infrastructure program, continued

work in energy, transportation, and outdoor recreation; successfully

launched new projects in economic and workforce recovery; and supported

Governors as they made once in a century decisions around k-12 education

nationwide.

In February of 2020, the NGA Center established a COVID-19 Task Force to provide Governors and their staff with up to date and actionable information related to the ongoing pandemic. As the public health crisis evolved, this effort evolved as well. Eventually bringing together expertise from across the entire organization to address the multifaceted response effort. This task force produced over seventy-five memos, publications, and policy trackers to analyze and share developments across the country. Additionally, the taskforce held over thirty briefings with leading public health experts for Governors' staff throughout the year.

To supplement our pandemic response, the NGA Center built out a new workstream to support Governors' legal counsels as they address numerous legal challenges in their states. While this work initially started in response to COVID, the work has broadened beyond the pandemic to look at

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issues related to executive power, the ongoing opioid crisis, and the impact of US Supreme Court decisions on the states. This work consists of three core elements: routine virtual briefings for legal counsel with nationally recognized experts, legal research memorandum to accompany the virtual briefings, and ad-hoc requests for technical assistance, which numbered over 100 during 2020.

In mid-2020 the NGA Center also launched a new program area focused on infrastructure policy. While we had previously engaged in work related to transportation infrastructure, this new section will be focused on the broad definition of infrastructure, including digital and physical, with the goal of providing governors a single point of contact as they plan to build out or upgrade infrastructure in their states. This new program builds on the accomplishments of our 2019/20 Chairman's Initiative, Infrastructure: Foundation for Success. This work is very closely related to important efforts that were expanded this year around broadband access, energy affordability, clean energy, transportation technology, and outdoor recreation/natural resources policy. These issues were significantly addressed in 2020 through written publications and virtual convenings.

Also core to our accomplishments in 2020 were new workstreams to support
Governors as they address the ongoing economic and workforce challenges
facing this nation. Throughout the spring of 2020 we convened weekly calls
with state workforce policy leads to understand the dynamics surrounding
state unemployment insurance systems as those systems were under
unprecedented demand pressures. Additionally, in 2020 we launched two new
projects to assist governors with workforce and economic recovery,

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including our Workforce Innovation Network and our Recovery and Reskilling network. The latter of those two convened state policymakers for routine discussions on strategies to reskill those workers left behind by the pandemic and how to leverage institutions of higher education, particularly two-year degree institutions. Both of these efforts are ongoing into 2021.

Finally, our team devoted considerable time and attention to supporting

Governors across a wide swath of K-12 education policy issues. Starting in
the Spring with a focus on how to effectively transition to virtual
learning, then with assistance on safely operating summer programs, then
how to safely reopen schools in the fall, and finally ongoing assistance
with those states focused on reopening schools and establishing robust

COVID testing programs. All the while, our team tracked the current state
of education policies throughout the states and planned a robust series of
engagements for 2021 around the longer-term impacts of school closure and
virtual learning.

Line 1a All vendors are paid by National Governors Association (NGA), a related organization. Therefore, National Governors Association Center for Best Practices did not file a form 1096 for 2019. Form 1096 was filed by NGA covering all vendors engaged by NGA and NGA Center for Best Practices.

The IRS Form 990 is prepared by an independent accounting firm, reviewed by senior members of management and reviewed and signed by the CFO.

The IRS Form 990 is then available on the organization's website, on the Guidestar website and upon request. This process has been approved by the organization's Finance Committee which was appointed by the Board of Directors.

Form 990, Part VI, Line 12c - Enforcement of Conflicts Policy

Employees must provide written notification to the executive director of a conflict of interest or potential conflict interest as soon as it occurs. In addition, the organization requires employees to certify that they have reviewed the conflict of interest policy on an annual basis. Officers and key employees(as defined by the IRS) must annually disclose their interests that could give rise to conflicts of interest, such as a list of family members, substantial business or investment holdings, and other

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transactions or affiliations with businesses and other organizations or those of family members. Officers and employees found to be in violation of conflict of interest policy are subject to disciplinary action or termination. For directors of the corporation, the organization relies on each governor's compliance with state ethics laws to avoid conflicts of interest and make any required disclosures. Any member of the organization may raise a possible conflict of interest with another member and act in accordance with the articles and bylaws of the organization to take action.

Form 990, Part VI, Line 15a - Compensation Process for Top Official The Executive Director receives a performance evaluation annually for consideration of merit pay increase effective on January 1 of each calendar year. Performance is evaluated by the current National Governors Association (NGA) Chair, current NGA Vice Chair and the immediate past NGA Chair collectively. In preparation for the performance evaluation, the Executive Director provides a self-evaluation to the current NGA Chair and an external market benchmarking analysis that shows salaries for comparable positions for the other Big 7 public interest groups as well as for other not-for-profit executives taken from several salary surveys. The current NGA Chair is responsible for convening the performance discussion, writing the performance evaluation and communicating the performance feedback to the Executive Director. At the conclusion of this evaluation process, the current NGA Chair writes a memo to the NGA Chief Operating Officer outlining the specifics of the merit pay increase and authorizing the action for purposes of payroll processing.
